

Purpose

The purpose of this document is to facilitate structured and relevant information sharing by land use proponents (organisations/investors/businesses) with Traditional Owner corporations of the Gove Peninsula, where significant development or new industry is proposed.

Overview

The completion of this form informs a 'gateway' assessment, that will enable Traditional Owner corporations to make a preliminary assessment of proposals and conduct (or commission) initial due diligence assessments¹ of proposals, in order to decide whether to proceed with engagement. Traditional Owners may elect to support the proposal to progress to further development/assessment or direct engagement, or may decide a project is not consistent with their aspirations for development on their land and advise they are not keen to consider the project further.

Endorsement by Traditional Owner corporations at this stage does not constitute approval by Traditional Owners to proceed with your proposal. However, support by relevant Traditional Owner corporations indicates a desire for further engagement.

What this process is not

- Please note that formal consultation with Traditional
 Owners to negotiate leases on Aboriginal Land is
 conducted by the Northern Land Council (NLC) separately
 to this Gateway Tool process. Due to the significant cost
 of consultation in remote areas, there is an expectation
 that the proponent(s) may be asked to make a financial
 contribution to any costs associated with consulting with
 Traditional Owners in relation to the proposed project.
- This form does not alter or displace any of a proponent's obligations to engage with relevant regulators in the Commonwealth and Northern Territory governments.

Context

To assist stakeholders and investors to understand their aspirations for the future, Traditional Owners of the Gove Peninsula have documented their vision for what should happen after Rio Tinto's bauxite mining operation closes in A new journey together, Traditional Owners' Vision for Gove Peninsula. All of East Arnhem is granted Aboriginal Land (or granted Aboriginal Land held in escrow) owned by Traditional Owners under the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* (ALRA). This means all development is by consent of the relevant Traditional Owners via relevant Northern Land Council processes. Further information about the Northern Land Council is available at www.nlc.org.au.

A range of tenure information, as well as other geospatial information is available at NR Maps.

The Gove Peninsula has unique land tenure characteristics and includes granted Aboriginal Land which has been vested in the Arnhem Land Aboriginal Land Trust, and granted Aboriginal Land held in escrow pending the expiry or early termination of the pre-existing Minerals Title and associated Special Purposes Leases. Development by consent requires that Traditional Owners, and the corporations they establish to advance their objectives, be empowered to make fully informed decisions regarding land access, industries and investment.

Although a number of other organisations might have a role in facilitating early engagement about the nature and extent of proposed land uses and proponents, those organisations are not ultimately decision-makers.

The Gove Peninsula is a special place within the broader East Arnhem region. Information about East Arnhem Land is available through Developing East Arnhem Limited's website through Invest East Arnhem. The East Arnhem Regional Economic Growth Committee has developed a Regional Economic Growth Plan, which proponents may wish to review. 


