# Acknowledgement of Country


The Yolŋu traditional landowners of East Arnhem practise one of the oldest living cultures in the world and have been living in this region for more than 60,000 years. The entirety of East Arnhem Land is Aboriginal land granted under the Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976, an important acknowledgement of the continuing ownership of, and connection to country.

Developing East Arnhem Limited (DEAL) acknowledges the various Yolŋu clans across East Arnhem who are the custodians of the land on which we live, learn and work. DEAL pays respect to elders past, present and emerging, and recognises the continuing connection to land, water, culture and community of First Nations people in East Arnhem and across Australia.

## About DEAL and the East Arnhem Region

### DEAL

Developing East Arnhem Limited (DEAL) is an independent not-for-profit organisation established to facilitate investment and economic development opportunities in East Arnhem between Yolŋu Traditional Owners, local organisations and businesses, governments, and investors. East Arnhem is currently transitioning from dependence on the long-term Rio Tinto mining operations, due to end by 2030. This has created the opportunity to develop a diversified economy that supports local jobs and infrastructure.

Situated in Nhulunbuy, DEAL works across the East Arnhem region and is uniquely positioned to drive development and investment opportunities to support the transition from mining dependence to a diversified economy that grows and strengthens local jobs and communities.

DEAL is optimistic about the future of the region, recognising the Traditional Owner vision for the future

of Nhulunbuy and the Gove Peninsula as a hub for all of Arnhem Land and a place where Yolŋu and Njapaki can live and work together in harmony.

We work closely with Traditional Owners to support them to:

- Explore industry development opportunities
- Advance investment opportunities by offering support and resources to manage important economic projects

We support the development of the tourism industry across East Arnhem, led by and for the benefit of Yolŋu people across the region.

We support existing and aspiring businesses on the Gove Peninsula and across key strategic parts of the region to grow and develop. We collaborate across the region, as trusted partners to businesses, governments and Traditional Owners.

We promote and market the economic opportunities of East Arnhem and act as a “front door” for investment in the region.

We are independent advocates for the development and growth of the region.

Our mission is to drive economic development in East Arnhem to promote the resilience of the region and opportunity for its people.

### East Arnhem

East Arnhem is steeped in Yolŋu history, culture and songlines making it one of the most culturally rich and significant places in Australia. The region is also unique in that 100 percent of the land is Aboriginal owned.

The Yolŋu Traditional Owners’ vision and aspiration for the region is to keep towns, communities, and homelands strong while enhancing economic development. DEAL’s work is driven by the Traditional Owners’ and communities’ aspirations for the future and is linked closely to the [East Arnhem Regional Economic Growth Plan \(REGP\)](#).

DEAL actively engages through the [Gove Peninsula Futures Reference Group \(GPFRG\)](#) and its Economic Development and Transition Work Stream. The purpose of this Work Stream is targeted to the following objectives:

- Ensure that Traditional Owners are informed of all potential economic development opportunities through the consistent application of an agreed communication process.
- Support proponents with an interest in the East Arnhem region to understand the principles of ‘development by consent’ and to engage with Traditional Owner corporations in a timely and appropriate manner.
- Supporting existing and new businesses to grow and diversify by coordinating efforts to both address barriers and facilitate enablers for growth and diversification at a regional or sectoral level.
- Maximising the benefits to the region from mine closure work, town transition and longer-term.
- Work collaboratively to foster investor confidence on the Gove Peninsula, including through promoting the work of this and related Work Streams under the GPFRG.
- Fostering respectful partnerships and Yolŋu businesses.

# DEAL Communications



## Our Strategic Direction

### SVA Strategic Review

During 2023/24, Social Ventures Australia (SVA) completed a strategic review of DEAL on behalf of our Members, the Northern Territory Government and Rio Tinto, aimed at ensuring DEAL's role and priorities are meeting the challenges and opportunities for the future of the region.

All businesses in the region were invited to participate in an online survey and focus group, while almost 40 organisations were invited to participate in an interview. SVA's final report was issued to DEAL and our Members in May 2024.

The strategic review confirmed that DEAL continues to play a critically important role in the region and that our current key activities remain relevant, with investment attraction and business development the most important focus areas. Whilst the review did not recommend significant changes to DEAL's role, opportunities were identified to amend our priorities (and key focus areas) and to improve our effectiveness so we might better assist the region.

- Increased focus on the Gove Peninsula, whilst continuing to work across key strategic parts of the broader region.
- Working closer with Traditional Owners to support them to:
  - explore industry development opportunities
  - progress specific investment opportunities
- A continued role in leading the development of the East Arnhem tourism industry.
- Increased focus on promoting and marketing the opportunities of East Arnhem and acting as the "front door" to investing in the region.
- Business development and growth:
  - Gove Peninsula – Increased focus on

supporting the development and growth of existing businesses on the Gove Peninsula - Region – Continued support for the development and growth of Yolŋu businesses across East Arnhem

- Continued role in managing and maintaining DEAL's housing portfolio on the Gove Peninsula to support the development of growth of the region.
- Continued role in supporting the progression of critical infrastructure investments across the region, and improved economic settings.

Since receiving SVA's final report, DEAL has been working to operationalise the findings and at the end of August 2024 we released our [2025-2030 Strategic Plan](#).

Building on DEAL's work to date, and as the region enters the period of transition, our priorities are clear: we are committed to supporting the delivery of a growing, diverse and sustainable economy across East Arnhem.



## Social Media



All primary communications channels saw increased engagement in comparison with FY2022/23 with:



The DEAL Facebook account seeing a 2.1K% increase in total page content interactions, and a 68% increase in total reach and 87 new followers (albeit a decrease in growth by 7.4% compared to FY2022/23).



The DEAL LinkedIn page published 13 posts over the course of 2023/24, with an average engagement rate of 0.07% and a total of 547 followers at 30 June 2024.



### Electronic Direct Mail (EDM) Communications

In 2023/24, DEAL published 15 newsletters consisting of quarterly updates, DEAL news and DEAL business updates. The average open rate was 53.47%.

We are committed to further improving our communications.



## Industry Development

Through our partnerships across the region, DEAL supports existing and emerging East Arnhem businesses to access information, networks, services and capital. DEAL facilitates planning and coordinates action to support emerging industries in the region and act as a 'front door' for businesses and investors from Australia and around the world. Our approach to industry development is guided by the aspirations of Yolŋu, evidence, planning and the underlying strengths of the region and its people.

## 2023/24 Highlights

### Forestry

The 3.5-year regional forestry project concluded offering research and development support to landowners. DEAL provided both capital funding and substantial in-kind support to this project, representing Traditional Owners, regional funders, and stakeholders on the forestry project steering committee, advocating for best project outcomes for Traditional Owners.

The 'Indigenous Commercial Forestry Opportunities: East Arnhem, Northern Australia' research has supported Traditional Owners to better understand their assets, develop new value-added timber products, assessed workforce and business requirements, provided market analysis, provided forestry management techniques, offered Indigenous community capacity building, and more.

### Aquaculture

DEAL continue to engage with investors interested in aquaculture sector development and have progressed initiatives which may support research and investment in the region.

### Agriculture

East Arnhem residents have enjoyed locally grown fresh produce delivered by an exciting agriculture initiative. DEAL supported this regionally collaborative project throughout the year, exploring what the region can grow, supported by an economic case for potential expansion. The community has embraced the locally grown produce, which has generated sales of fresh rocket, baby leaf lettuce, cucumber, zucchini, gem squash, pak choy, pumpkin, radish, watermelon, basil, and more.

With support of consultants [The Palladium Group](#), this pilot has demonstrated what opportunities there are for growing produce in the region, as well as plans to create an agribusiness hub. This hub could provide the opportunity for people from homelands and schools to learn new skills and methods for growing produce at home to achieve improved food security.

At [Garma Festival 2024](#), the working group had the opportunity to showcase some of the produce to the community and event attendees. The farm has the backing of several key groups, including the local Gumatj Corporation, Rirratjingu Aboriginal Corporation (RAC), North East Arnhem Land Aboriginal Corporation (NEAL), Northern Land Council, NT Government, Rio Tinto, and Developing East Arnhem Limited.

### Medical Retrieval

DEAL was pleased to deliver the "East Arnhem Medical Retrieval Options and Analysis Paper", presenting to the Northern Territory Government late in 2023. The paper is a comprehensive assessment to understand gaps in regional medical retrieval services and provide practical options to address these gaps.

This extensive research and consulting initiative relied heavily on community consultation and input. DEAL would like to thank key organisations and community members for their contributions and [CareFlight](#) for the opportunity to lead this project. DEAL acknowledges the incredible work of organisations such as CareFlight, government health departments, police and rescue, regional service providers, and ambulance services, who contribute to the safety of all Territorians.

### Low Carbon / Renewables

Carbon markets are both current and emerging sectors; DEAL undertook preliminary research to explore what opportunities might exist for the region in energy transition and renewables, climate change (regeneration and protection), and carbon markets including blue carbon (mangroves, wetlands, and sea grass).

### Human Services

DEAL supported an initiative to explore opportunities for the Care Economy across East Arnhem, which involved working with the community to identify new models of care reform operations including the associated workforce requirements. DEAL provided facilitation support, data and research, and engaged PWC consultants to assist with this project. An aged care and disability Reference Group was established, which progressed the initiative of identifying future opportunities that will benefit community members and participants.





# Tourism



## 2023/24 Highlights

### Destination Management Plan

The [East Arnhem Land Destination Management Plan](#) (DMP) provides a roadmap for the region to achieve collaborative and sustainable growth of the tourism industry through to 2030. The regional Project Implementation Team (PIT) oversees implementation of the DMP and is responsible for ensuring actions within the Plan are taken forward. In 2023/24, the PIT met quarterly to progress key priorities such as tourism experience development, data capture, workforce development and business support.

### Product Development

There are significant growth opportunities in the East Arnhem Land region to progress and a strong interest to develop tourism product across all sub-regions. In 2023/24, DEAL worked with several operators to support the development of new tourism experiences for visitors.

DEAL facilitated a stakeholder meeting with representatives from Milindji Aboriginal Corporation, Gong-dal Aboriginal Corporation and Gapuwiyak Culture and Arts in September 2023. Aligning with Milindji Aboriginal Corporation's Board meeting, DEAL led discussions with Traditional Owners as to current tourism aspirations and the development of a new cultural tour situated by Lake Evella. While visiting the area, DEAL undertook site inspections and presented ideas and recommendations to the Board for the cultural tour outline, including proposed itinerary, interpretation and resourcing requirements.

Milindji delivered a trial tour in November 2023 with approximately six to eight participants, and with DEAL's support secured a contract with tag-along tour group Great Divide Tours to deliver their first cultural tourism experiences in 2024.

### Tourism Study Tour

Identified as a short-term priority in the East Arnhem Land Destination Management Plan, DEAL successfully secured Federal Government funding through NIAA to support the delivery of a tourism study tour. The funding will support travel costs and tourism activities for selected Yolŋu and/or Anindilyakwa Traditional Owners, individuals and entrepreneurs will participate in the interstate tourism business immersion tour in 2024/25.

### East Arnhem Live

Multi-year funding was secured by DEAL through the Northern Territory Government's Community Benefit Fund Program to support delivery of the inaugural East Arnhem Live Festival in 2022, and subsequent festivals in 2023 and 2024. DEAL's Tourism Development Officer worked with festival organisers, Aris & Grimes, to support on-ground marketing and promotion of the 2023 event and prepare and submit funding applications for the upcoming 2024 festival.

### Yolŋu Business Case Studies

DEAL contracted Aris & Grimes to develop three case studies across the region showcasing local Yolŋu businesses and presenting key learnings, knowledge and insights. In 2023/24, a case study was developed for Yolŋu owned and operated business Liya Wanhurr Camping and Tours and is being utilised to promote the businesses' tourism experiences and inspire other Yolŋu tourism entrepreneurs.

### Visitor Permits, Access and Servicing

DEAL developed a [permit awareness video](#) and accompanying [factsheet](#) to encourage awareness and compliance in permit requirements and processes of

the East Arnhem Land region. Released in March 2024, input was gathered from the Northern Land Council, Dhimurru Aboriginal Corporation and Anindilyakwa Land Council as the relevant permit issuing organisations. The materials were distributed online via Tourism NT's consumer website, Tourism Top End and DEAL, handed out at intra-Territory and interstate industry events, and promoted in Tourism Top End's Visitor Information Centre's in Darwin and Katherine.


### Events Packaging

DEAL's Tourism Development Manager recently worked with East Arnhem Live Festival organisers to develop strategies to increase visitor attendance and local tourism packages for the 2024 festival, with the aim to drive visitation and encourage visitors to stay in the region longer and book experiences offered by local tourism operators. The packages were promoted via the Travel Gateway platform.

### Destination Marketing

DEAL plays a lead role in delivering destination marketing and communications for the East Arnhem region, specifically in the development of engaging, informative and relevant content for the regional tourism website ([eastarnhemland.com.au](#)) and its social media platforms.

DEAL recently reviewed and updated the East Arnhem Land and Central Arnhem Road visitor guides to ensure relevance of visitor information specific to the adventure drive with a focus on safety considerations, driving conditions, suggested itineraries, frequently asked questions and other visitor information relevant to East Arnhem Land. The factsheets were distributed to Nhulunbuy, Katherine and Darwin visitor information centres and made available to local businesses that provide visitor information.

## Community Support



### 2023/24 Highlights

#### Gonyangara (Gove Port) Tourism Precinct

A substantial milestone was reached for the Gonyangara (Gove Port) Tourism Precinct awarding tender to complete the major and final package of works. This is a significant boost to economic development and tourism opportunities, and will provide better tourism facilities for recreational users, charter vessels and other marine operators.

Three local Nhulunbuy businesses including two Aboriginal businesses will work to deliver the new facilities. The marine and landside construction contract includes building:

- a new extended rock groyne that vehicles and pedestrians can access
- careening facilities that vessels can dock alongside for maintenance
- a floating pontoon extending out from the groyne
- a washdown bay
- car park upgrades
- an entry structure


The \$9.3 million Gonyangara (Gove Port) Tourism Precinct project is jointly funded by the Australian Government through the Aboriginals Benefit Account (\$5.45 million) to the Gumatj Corporation, the Northern Territory Government (\$1.75 million), and Developing East Arnhem Limited (\$2.1 million).

#### Arnhem Optic Fibre Upgrade

DEAL made a \$360,000 investment towards the \$8 million Arnhem optic-fibre (backhaul) upgrade, to significantly increase bandwidth availability in all the mainland communities between (and including) Jabiru and Nhulunbuy. This project was completed in early 2024 and has provided improved broadband services for the Arnhem Space Centre on the Gove Peninsula.

#### Economic Development Fund

DEAL provided financial assistance to support the development and growth of a local business and to enhance the economic wellbeing of the local communities. Following the SVA strategic review, we are also exploring ways to better leverage and deploy our Economic Development Fund as part of our increased focus on supporting the development and growth of businesses on the Gove Peninsula.





## Housing

### 2023/24 Highlights

As part of DEAL's establishment, Rio Tinto provided DEAL with 250 properties (178 houses, 72 flats) to support economic development in East Arnhem. DEAL manages and maintains these housing assets in Nhulunbuy to support ongoing economic and business growth.

The DEAL Housing portfolio makes up 17% of all properties in Nhulunbuy. The portfolio continues to be at full capacity. With over 100 applications on the waitlist, there is significant demand that cannot be met with the DEAL Housing portfolio alone. Working closely with businesses and other housing providers in the region, we seek to understand the housing challenges businesses are facing and work diligently to maximise opportunities where possible.

In 2023/24, we have undertaken more work in housing utilisation and allocation to better support all businesses that are seeking local housing.

### Occupancy

We have been pleased to support local businesses who have reached out seeking to maximise utilisation within their own housing portfolios and undertake property consolidations. This has included downsizing or upsizing properties, as well as swapping flats and houses dependent on workforce size. Some organisations have been able to invest in private housing or housing construction for their workforce, enabling properties to be returned for reallocation to businesses on our waitlist.

Working proactively together has not only allowed businesses to consolidate costs but has allowed DEAL to allocate housing to long term waitlist applicants – a key focus for this year. During the 2023/24 financial year, six houses and four flats have been swapped or reallocated. This has enabled the team to provide some relief to long term waitlist applications, with six new allocations to Gove Peninsula businesses who have been on the waitlist for up to four years.

### Maintenance and Capital Works

The DEAL Housing team has been working through its capital improvement program across its 250 houses and flats. Key achievements include delivery of:

- Internal and external painting
- Electrical upgrades
- Bathroom upgrades
- House and carport re-roofs, including vapour barrier replacements
- Reinstating lighting in the town flats
- Window cleaning and roof hatch replacements across all flat blocks
- Town Flats garden reticulation reinstated

Through our Asset Management Plan and general property maintenance, DEAL has invested over \$2 million into the economy in 2023/24 with 90% of housing spend going to local suppliers.

The DEAL Housing team rely on local contractors to deliver our maintenance and capital plans, providing high quality housing to Nhulunbuy businesses.



## Business Development and Support

In early 2021, DEAL created the Business Development and Support function to support Yolŋu businesses across the East Arnhem region. Having been successful in obtaining financial support in 2023 as part of the NIAA Indigenous Advancement Strategy, the funding has recently been approved for a further two years. This will enable DEAL to work with new and emerging Yolŋu businesses to support their economic and business aspirations and drive economic growth for the region.



### 2023/24 Highlights

#### Bulungkunum Corporation Limited

Bulungkunum Corporation Limited (Bulungkunum) is an Aboriginal organisation with Traditional Owner board members from Ramingining and Milingimbi.

DEAL provided investment support to Bulungkunum in 2021 through the Economic Development Fund to support the establishment of their Business Hub located in Ramingining. The Business Hub opened on 2 September 2021 as part of an initiative to equip local Yolŋu entrepreneurs to develop their business ideas and provide local employment opportunities to the East Arnhem region.

Bulungkunum leases spaces in the Business Hub and properties in Ramingining to organisations who deliver their services to the Community. The Corporation also operate a fishing business, and have recently started a lawnmowing business which has enabled them to employ another three Yolŋu staff. There are future plans to start a laundry in one of the shops at the Business Hub.

Bulungkunum has been a client of DEAL Business Development and Support Services since 2021.

Recent support has included facilitating ORIC compliance activities, and assisting with arrangements for roofing repairs for the Business Hub, repairs and new equipment for the fishing boat, motor vehicles and lawnmowers. They are well positioned to continue as a sustainable and successful organisation supporting positive impacts and opportunities for their community.

#### Partnerships

DEAL continued to fund an ongoing partnership with [Enterprise Learning Projects](#) (ELP). ELP delivers incubation and mentoring programs for Yolŋu business entrepreneurs who are looking to grow or evolve their existing business, and expand their networks and skills. ELP are a member of the Council of Australian Social Enterprise Intermediaries (CASEI) and recently collaborated on the development of the "Five Stages of Social Enterprise Development".

In 2023, we entered a partnership with North East Arnhem Land Aboriginal Corporation (NEAL) for the provision of governance, finance and bookkeeping services to support Yolŋu businesses. This partnership ended in early 2024.



## Governance and Operations

DEAL is committed to maintaining and improving the systems and processes that have been developed since DEAL's establishment, including financial and risk management, governance, and culture.

Through our Board of Directors, we maintain independent and professional governance. The DEAL Board meets regularly throughout the year to discuss progress, challenges, projects and the organisation's

finances. Each year, an Annual General Meeting (AGM) is held with the Board and its Members, the Northern Territory Government and Rio Tinto, coinciding with the DEAL annual Community Update.

In 2023/24, five formal board meetings were held on the following dates:



# Sponsorship

- Funding support of \$30,000 was provided to The Arnhem Aboriginal Business Council (AABC), who represent the interests of 100% Aboriginal owned businesses from a range of industries across Arnhem Land and the Groote Archipelago. The AABC was formed in response to a lack of a regional business advocacy body more broadly, but also acknowledging the particular interests and responsibilities of regional Aboriginal businesses to their communities and members, being the Indigenous people of the region.
- In partnership with UNSW, Laynhapuy and Knowledge Water, DEAL supported an opportunity for an East Arnhem team to attend the inaugural 2023 UNSW First Nations Residential Business Competition in Sydney, utilising \$13,245 funding to support flights for five participants. The team worked on a project to use social media and payment platforms to support online store presence and analytics for existing products (Knowledge Water, Yirrkala Rangers Bush Products) as well as promotion and advertising to support emerging products.
